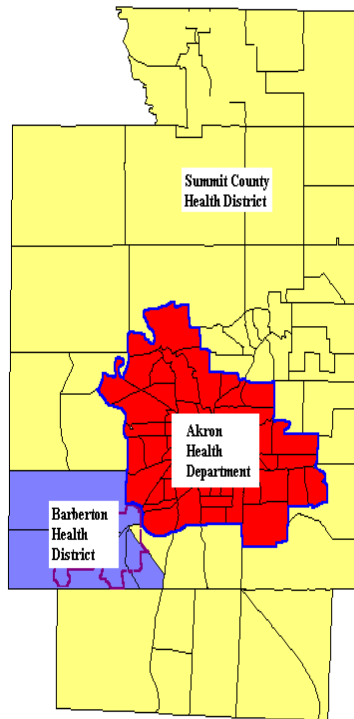
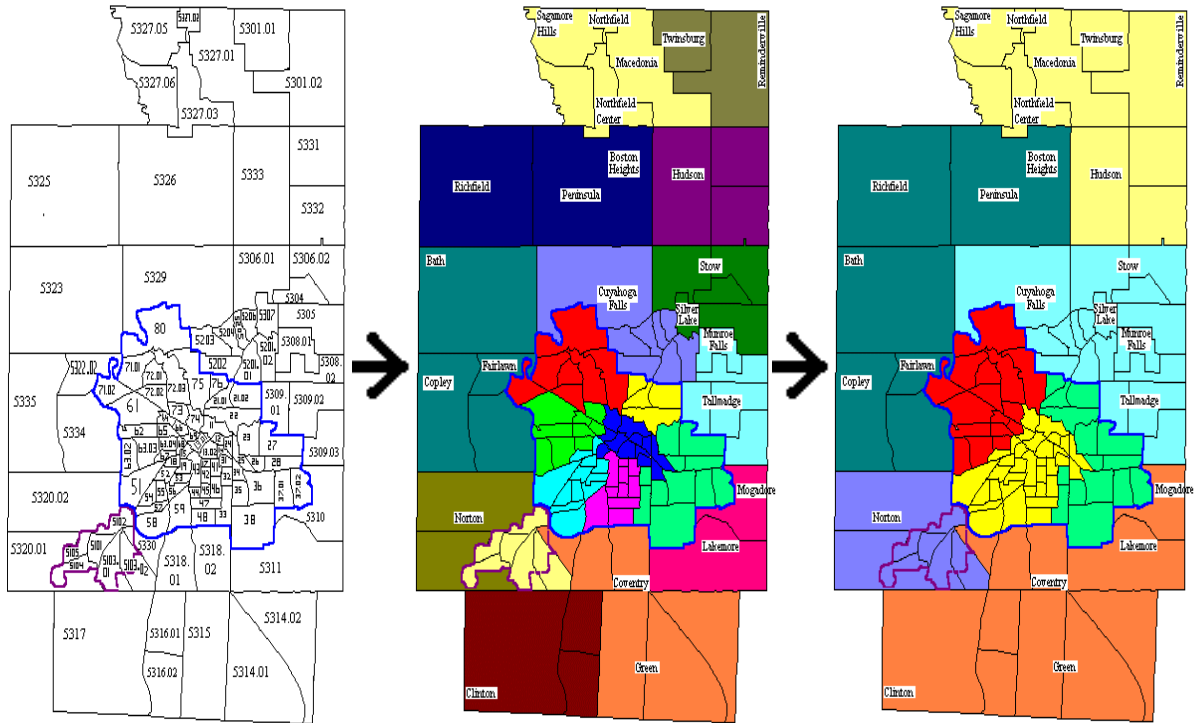

## Location Grouping

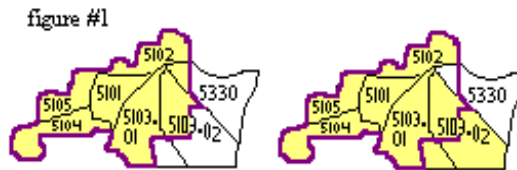
Summit County is comprised of 121 separate census tracts. Rates of events, for which data is available, can be calculated for each of the census tracts. The rates from one census tract can be compared to another and, if multiple years of data exist, within the same tract over time. However, if the number of events within a census tract is small due to small populations or rare events, the rate that is produced may be statistically unreliable. If this is the case, demonstrating a meaningful trend over time or comparing one population to another is not possible. This situation is exacerbated by comparing rates between sub-populations, e.g. by race, gender, or age group. To remedy the problem, this report provides 3 alternative groupings of census tracts that will provide larger numbers of events within well-defined areas and populations.

The first grouping strategy involves combining the 121 original census tracts into 20 clusters of census tracts. Efforts were made to maintain demographic homogeneity within the clusters, i.e. to the extent possible, census tracts within a cluster have similar mean per capita incomes, levels of racial diversity, etc. Identified neighborhoods were kept intact to the extent that census boundaries would permit. These efforts were limited due census numbering, e.g. vital statistics for census tracts numbered 5013.01 and 5013.02 are reported inclusively as 5013 necessitating their inclusion in the same cluster.

The second grouping strategy involves further combining the clusters in the first strategy into 8 regional census tract groups. The efforts and limitations described in the first strategy apply to this strategy as well.

The third grouping strategy simply breaks Summit County down into the jurisdictions of the three health departments, Akron Health Department, Barberton Health District, and Summit County Health District.

The pages that follow illustrate the 20 census tract clusters, the 8 regional census tract groups, and the 3 health department jurisdictions. Basic demographic profiles, natality data, and mortality data are included for each entity. Unless otherwise stated, the demographic profiles and denominators used in rate calculations are based on the 2000 U.S. Census. It should be noted that the need to keep census tracts whole for statistical soundness results in demographics that may differ slightly from those reported by the Census Bureau for geopolitically defined towns, townships, and cities. For example, while the City of Barberton encompasses approximately 75% of census tract 5103.01 and 50% of tract 5103.02 both of these tracts are included in toto for the census cluster and regional census group. Additionally, because Barberton's city limits only occupy approximately 20% of census tract 5330, that tract was not included in the cluster or regional group (see figure #1 below). The mortality and natality data are compiled from 1997 and 1998 Ohio Department of Health vital records reports.



## **20 Summit County Census Tract Clusters** **Matching census tracts to cities, towns, townships, & neighborhoods**

In an effort to obtain health indicator case numbers large enough to provide statistically reliable rates for comparison by geographic areas, the following 20 clusters have been defined and described:

**Akron's Northwest Cluster** encompasses the neighborhoods of Merriman Valley, Northwest Akron, and Fairlawn Heights. The cluster is defined by its inclusion of census tracts: 5071.01, 5071.02, 5072.01, 5072.02, 5072.03, 5075, and 5080.

**Akron's Northern Cluster** encompasses the neighborhoods of North Hill and Chapel Hill. The cluster is defined by its inclusion of census tracts 5021.01, 5021.02, 5022, and 5076.

**Akron's Western Cluster** encompasses the neighborhoods of Wallhaven, Highland Square, and West Akron. The cluster is defined by its inclusion of census tracts: 5061, 5062, 5063.02, 5063.03, 5063.04, 5064, 5065, 5066, and 5073.

**Akron's Southwestern Cluster** encompasses the neighborhoods of Lane/Wooster, Summit Lake, Rolling Acres, and Kenmore. The cluster is defined by its inclusion of census tracts: 5018, 5019, 5051, 5052, 5053, 5054, 5055, 5056, 5057, 5058, 5067, and 5068.

**Akron's Central Cluster** encompasses the neighborhoods of Elizabeth Park Valley, Middlebury, and Downtown Akron. It is defined by its inclusion of census tracts 5011, 5012, 5013.01, 5013.02, 5014, 5015, 5024, 5025, 5031, 5034, 5069, and 5074.

**Akron's Southern Cluster** encompasses the neighborhoods of the University of Akron, South Akron, and Firestone Park. The cluster is defined by its inclusion of census tracts 5017, 5041, 5042, 5043, 5044, 5045, 5046, 5047, 5048, and 5059.

**Akron's Southeastern Cluster** encompasses the neighborhoods of Goodyear Heights, East Akron, and Ellet. The cluster is defined by its inclusion of census tracts 5023, 5026, 5027, 5028, 5032, 5033, 5035, 5036, 5037.01, 5037.02, and 5038.

**The Barberton Cluster** encompasses the City of Barberton and the area just beyond its eastern city limits in Coventry Township. The cluster is defined by the inclusion of census tracts 5101, 5102, 5103.01, 5103.02, 5104, and 5105.

**The Munroe Falls / Tallmadge Cluster** encompasses Munroe Falls and Tallmadge and is defined by its inclusion of census tracts 5308.01, 5308.02, 5309.01, 5309.02, and 5309.03.

**The Cuyahoga Falls Cluster** encompasses Cuyahoga Falls and is defined by its inclusion of census tracts 5201.01, 5201.02, 5202, 5203, 5204, 5205, 5206, and 5329.

**The Springfield Cluster** encompasses Springfield Township and the municipalities of Mogadore and Lakemore. The cluster is defined by its inclusion of census tracts 5310 and 5311.

**The Coventry / Green Cluster** encompasses the majority of Coventry Township, East Liberty, Green Township, and Greensburg. The cluster is defined by its inclusion of census tracts 5314.01, 5314.02, 5315, 5318.01, 5318.02, and 5330.

**The Franklin Cluster** encompasses Franklin Township, Manchester, and the Village of Clinton and is defined by its inclusion of census tracts 5316.01, 5316.02, and 5317.

**The Norton Cluster** encompasses the City of Norton and the area of Coventry Township immediately south of the City of Barberton. The cluster is defined by its inclusion of census tracts 5320.01 and 5320.02.

**The Copley / Bath / Fairlawn Cluster** encompasses Bath and Copley Townships and the City of Fairlawn. The cluster is defined by its inclusion of census tracts 5322.01, 5323, 5334, and 5335.

**The Richfield / Boston Cluster** encompasses Richfield and Boston Townships, Peninsula, and Boston Heights. The cluster is defined by its inclusion of census tracts 5325 and 5326.

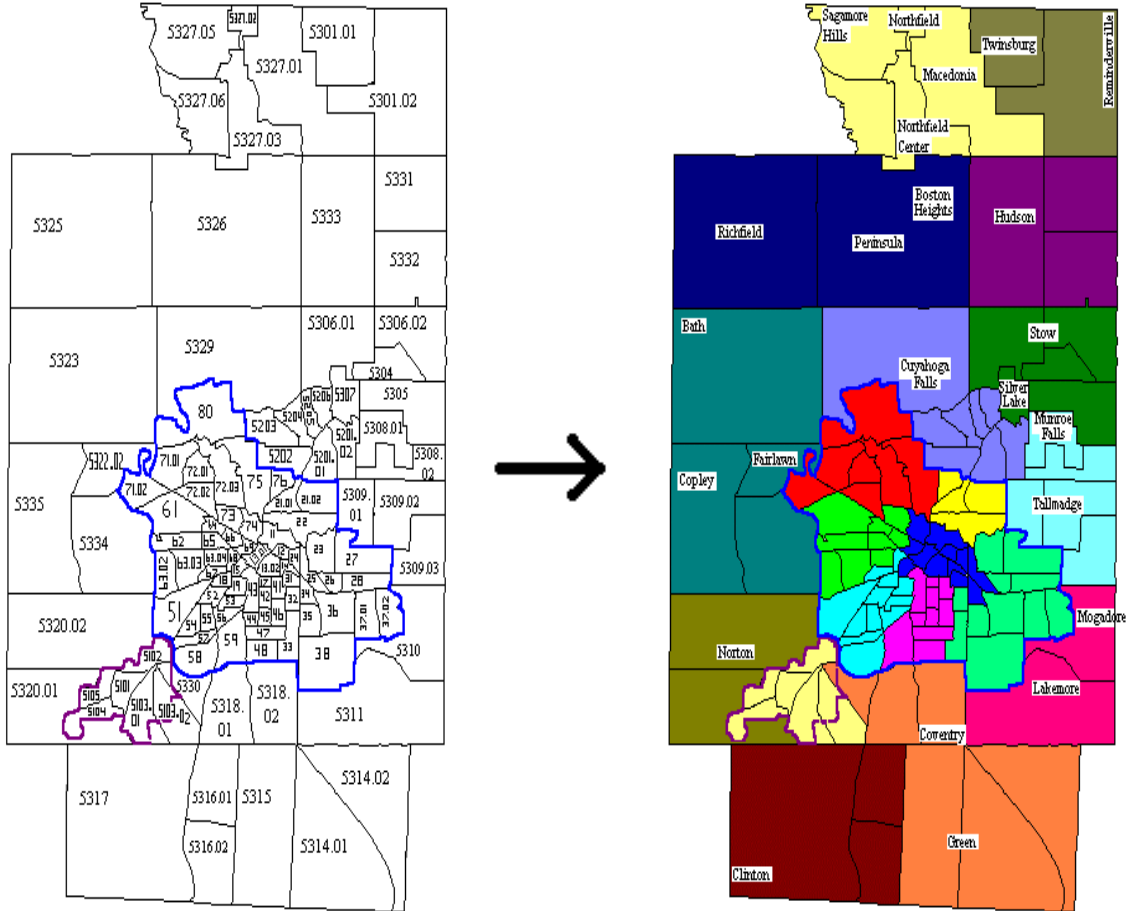
**The Stow / Silver Lake Cluster** encompasses Stow and Silver Lake and is defined by its inclusion of census tracts 5304, 5305, 5306.01, 5306.02, and 5307.

**The Hudson Cluster** encompasses Hudson Township and is defined by its inclusion of census tracts 5331, 5332, and 5333.

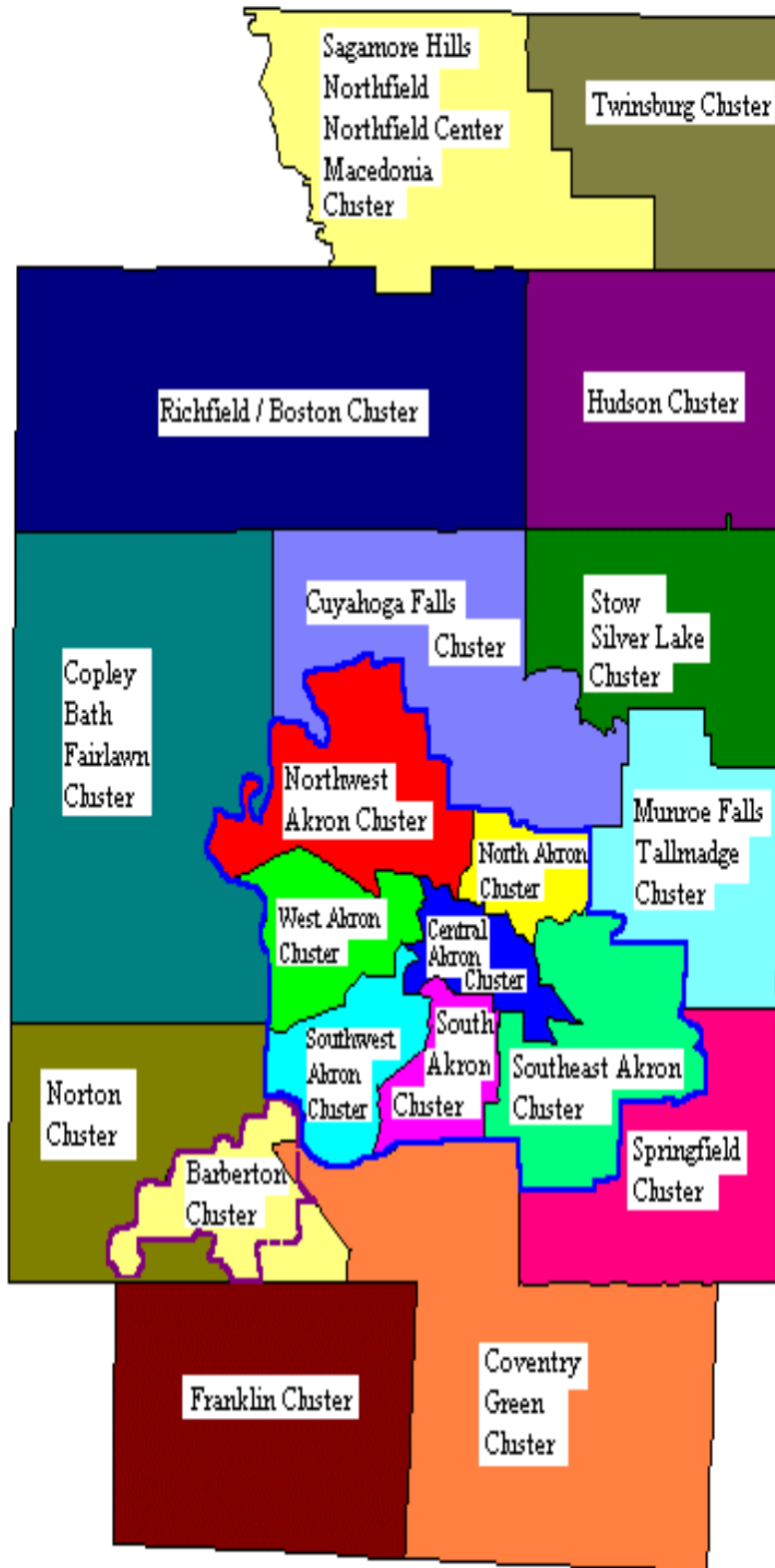
**The Twinsburg Cluster** encompasses Twinsburg and Reminderville and is defined by its inclusion of census tracts 5301.01 and 5301.02.

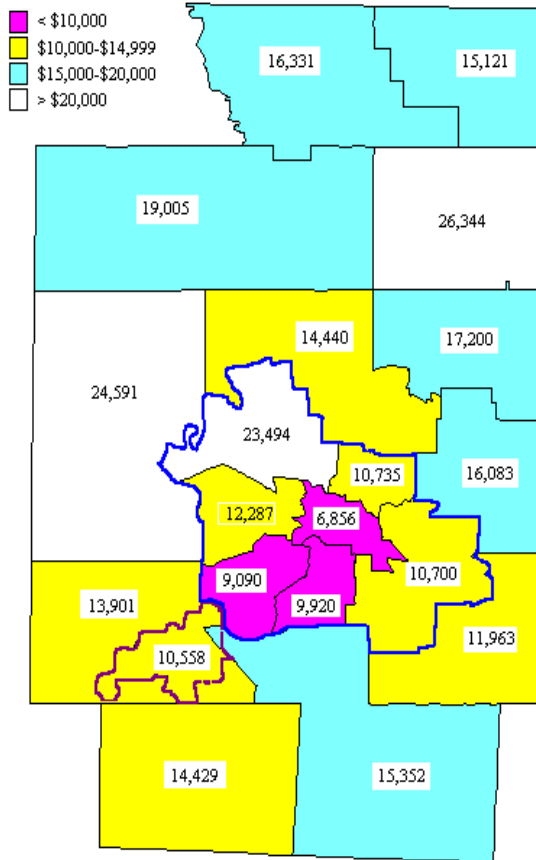

**Matching census tracts to cities, towns, townships, & neighborhoods**



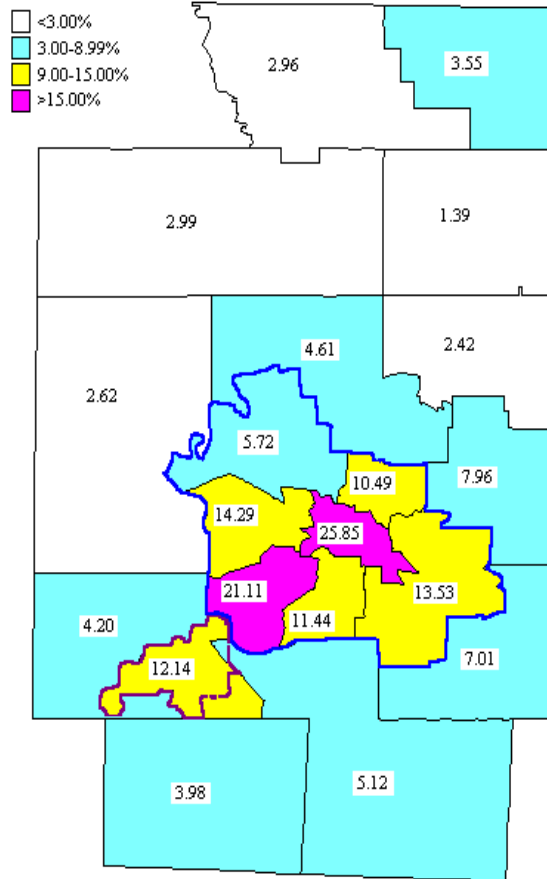




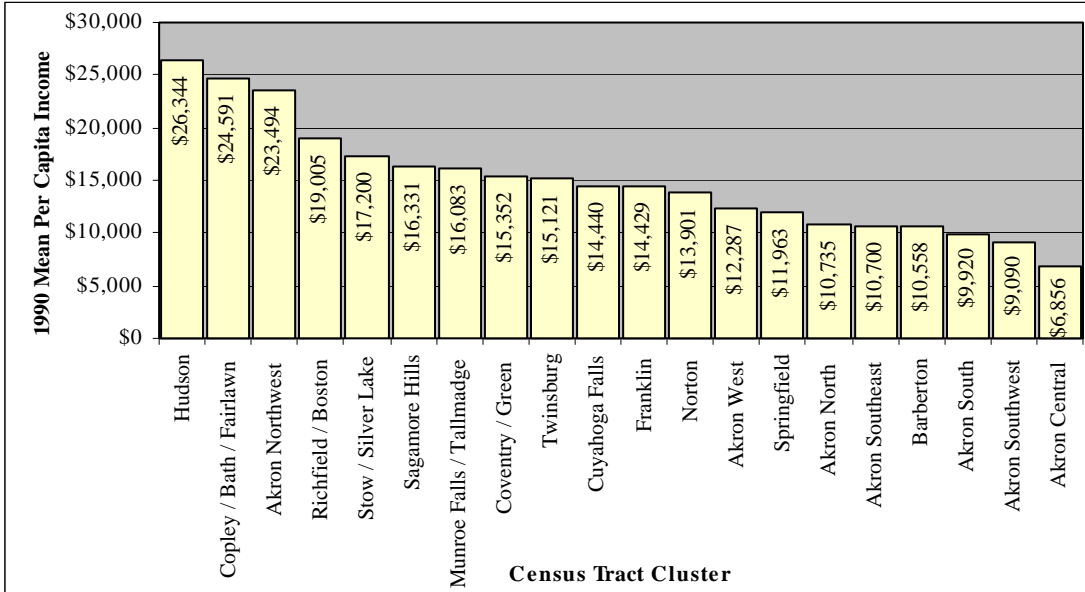
**1990 Mean Per Capita Income**

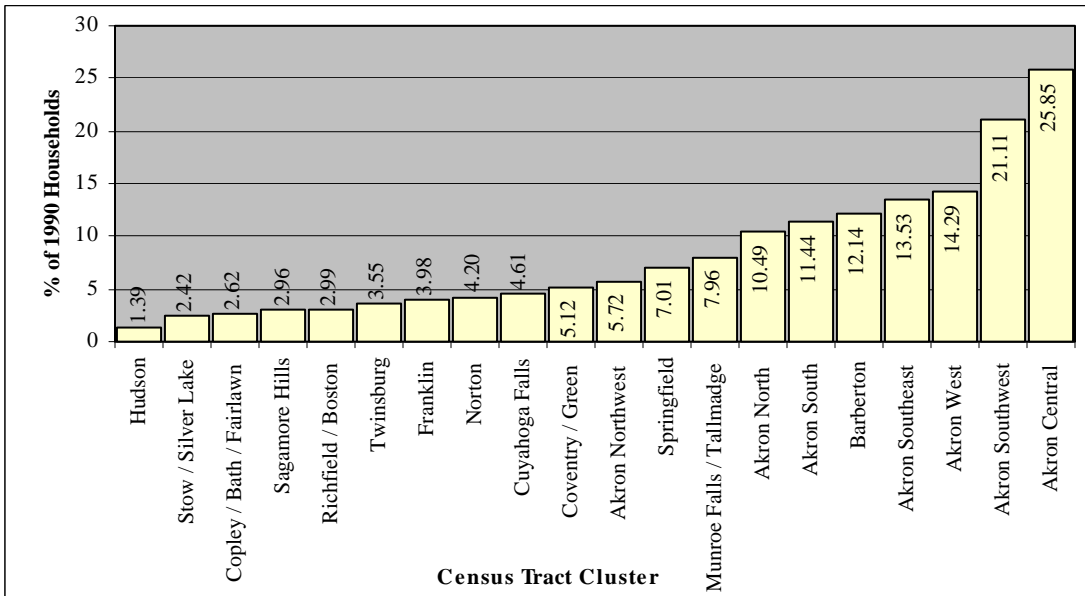
**1990 % of Households Receiving Public Assistance**

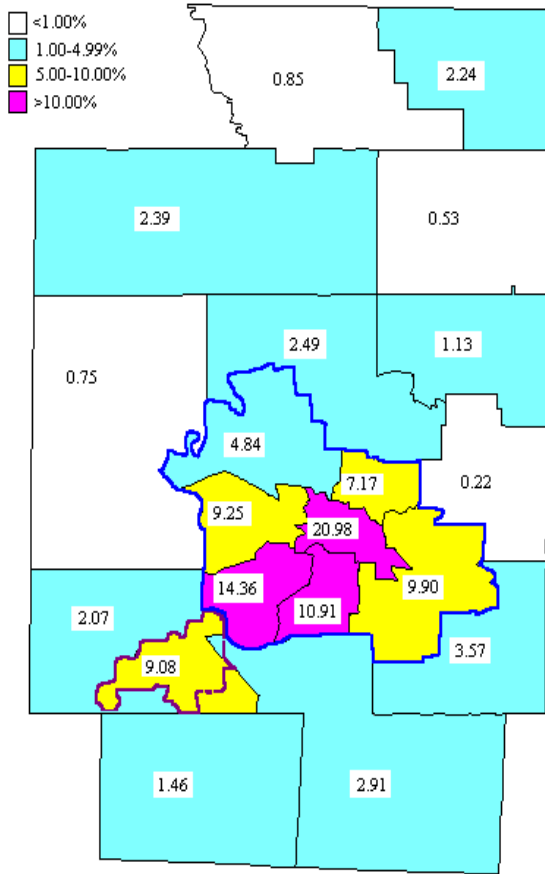
**1990 Mean Annual Per Capita Income (2000 Data is not yet available)**



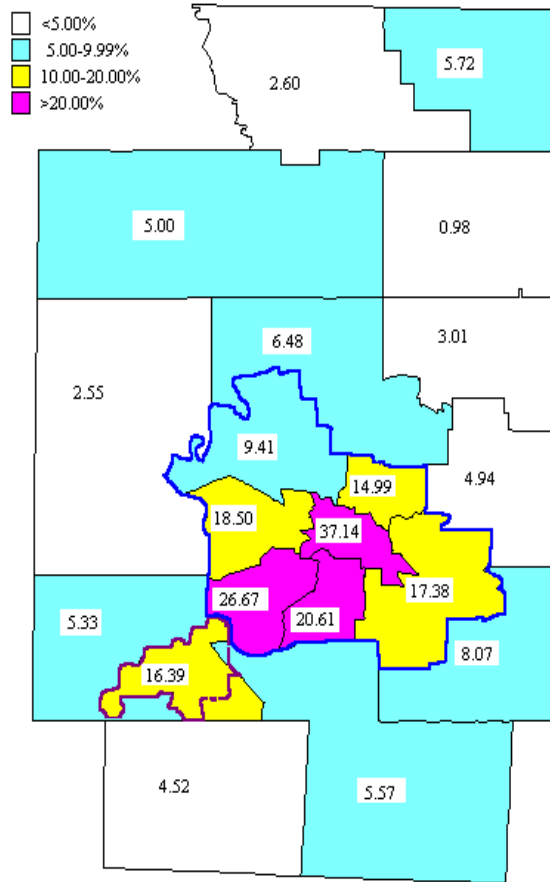

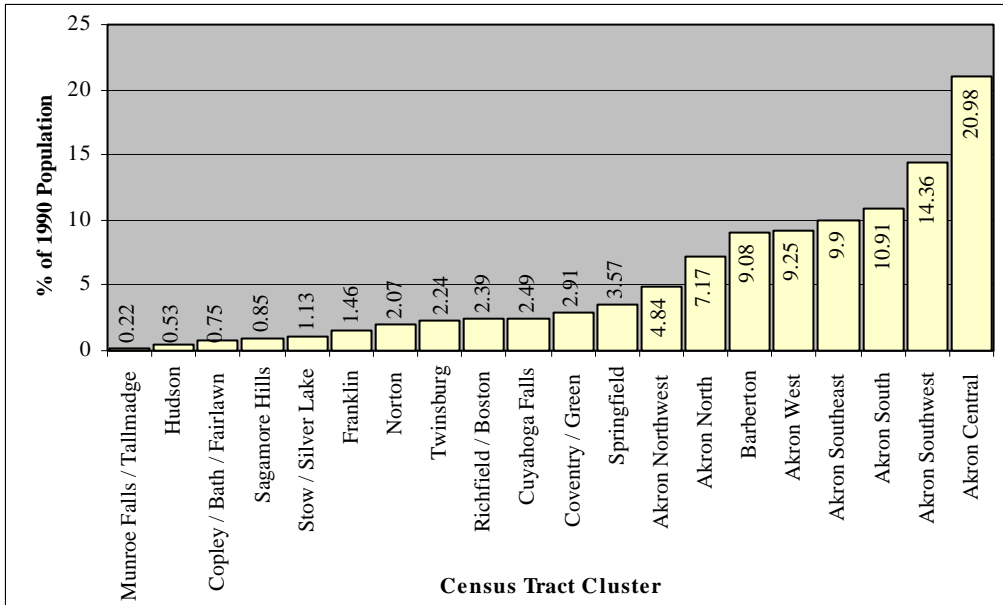
**1990 Income : Poverty < 0.5**

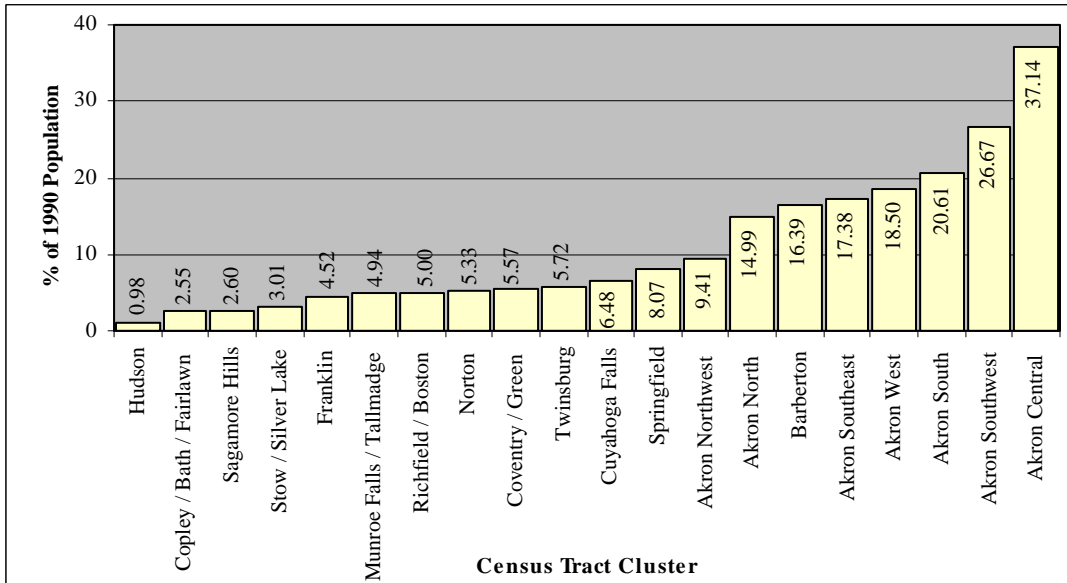
**1990 Income : Poverty < 1.0**

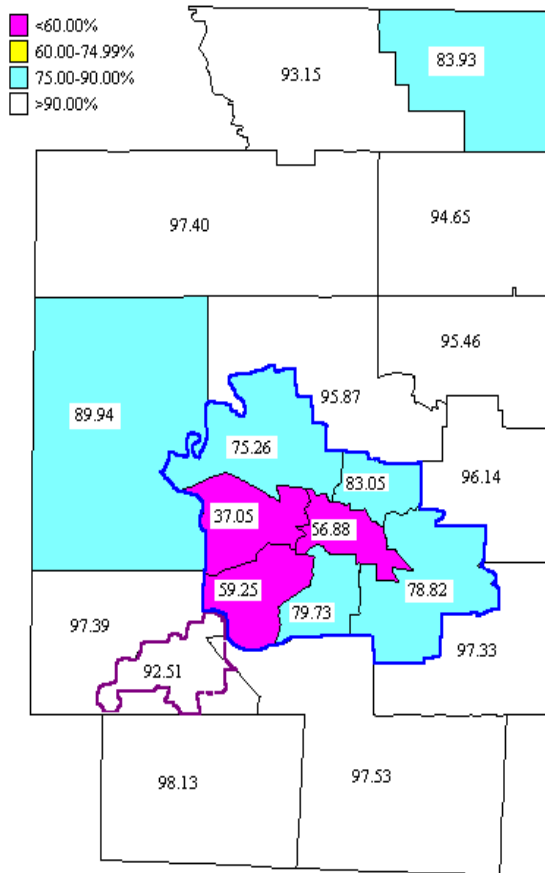
**1990 Income < 0.5 Poverty Level (2000 Data is not yet available)**



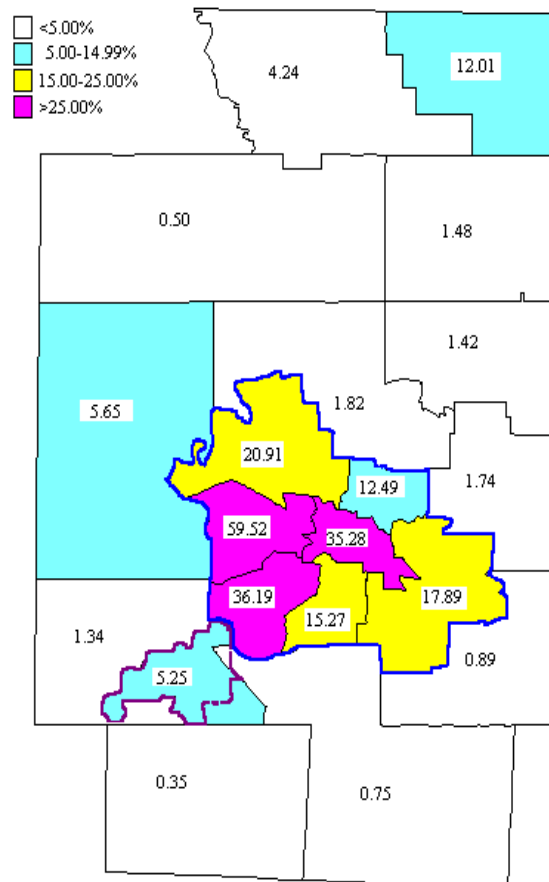

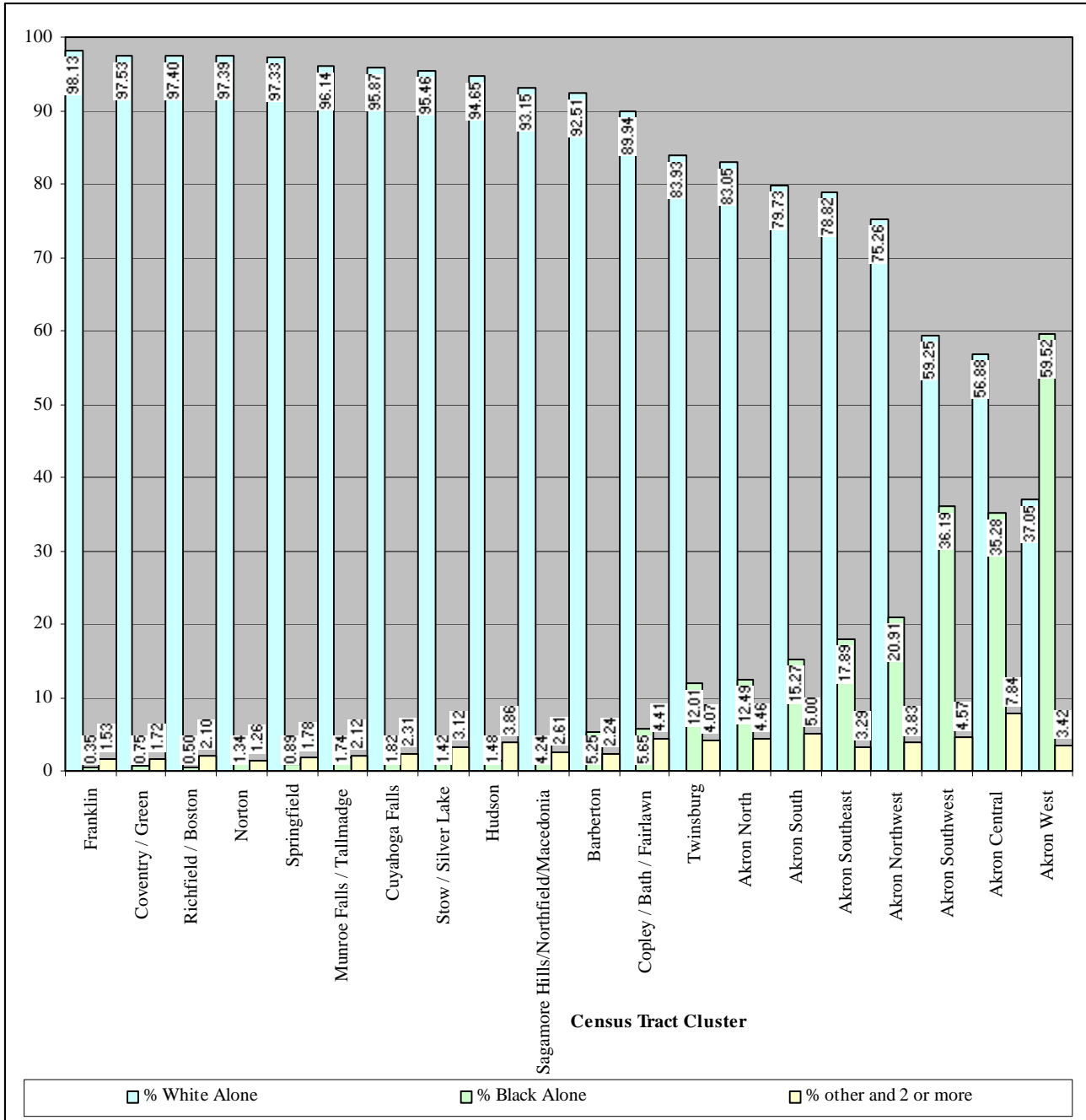
**Distribution of Population listed as  
“White Alone” (2000)**



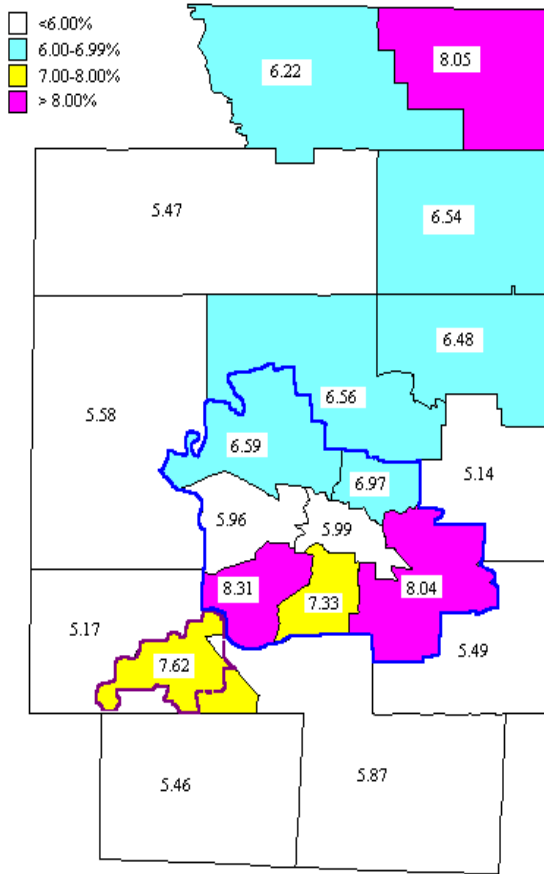
**Distribution of Population listed as

(2000)**



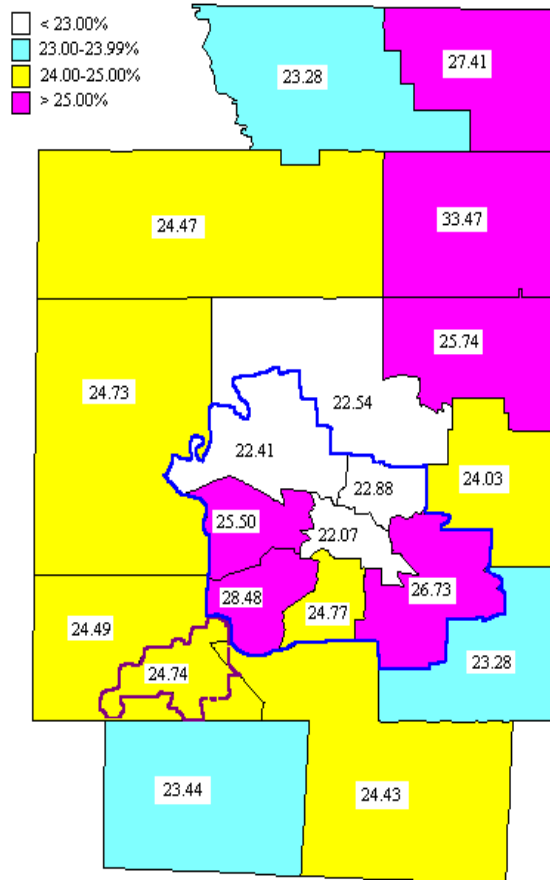
## 2000 Racial Distribution

< 5 Years Old**

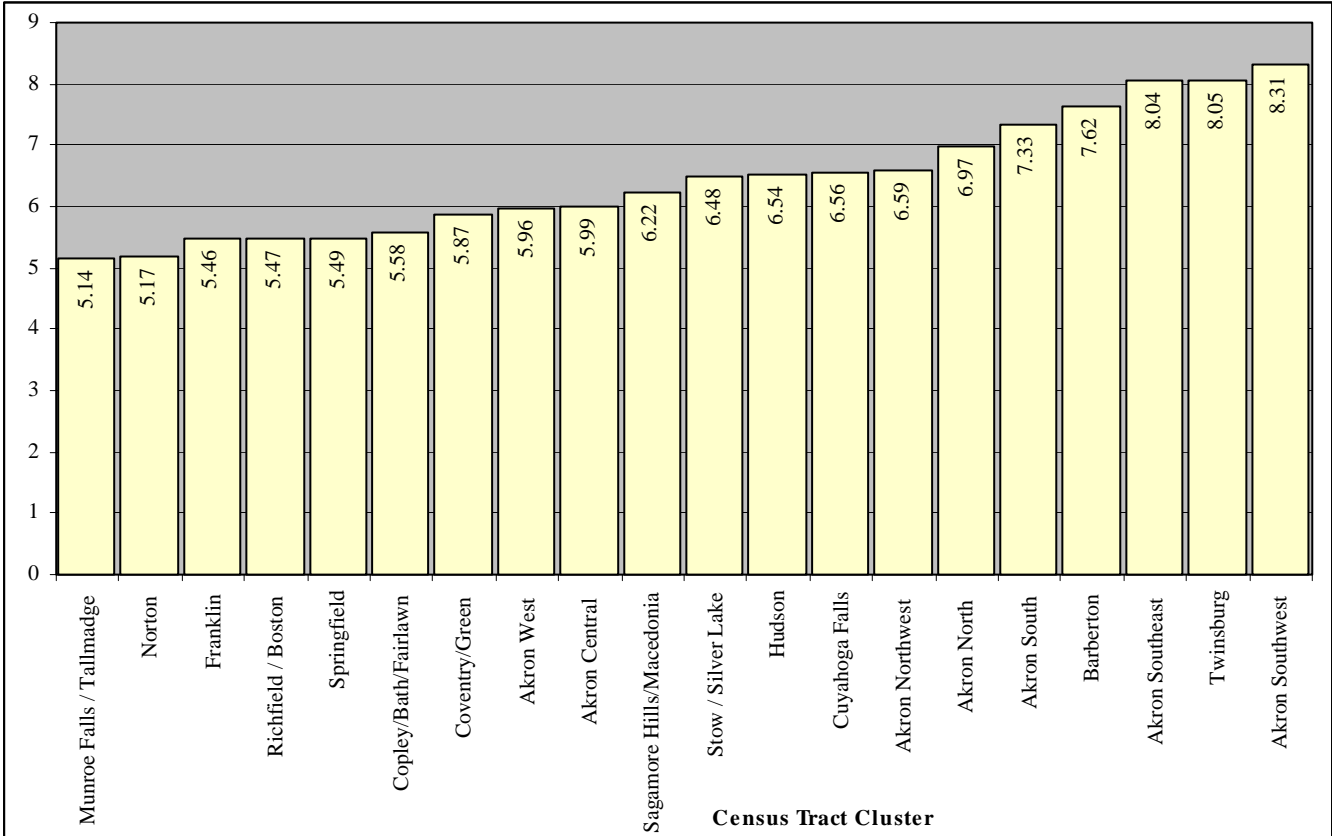


**% of Cluster Population  
< 18 Years Old**

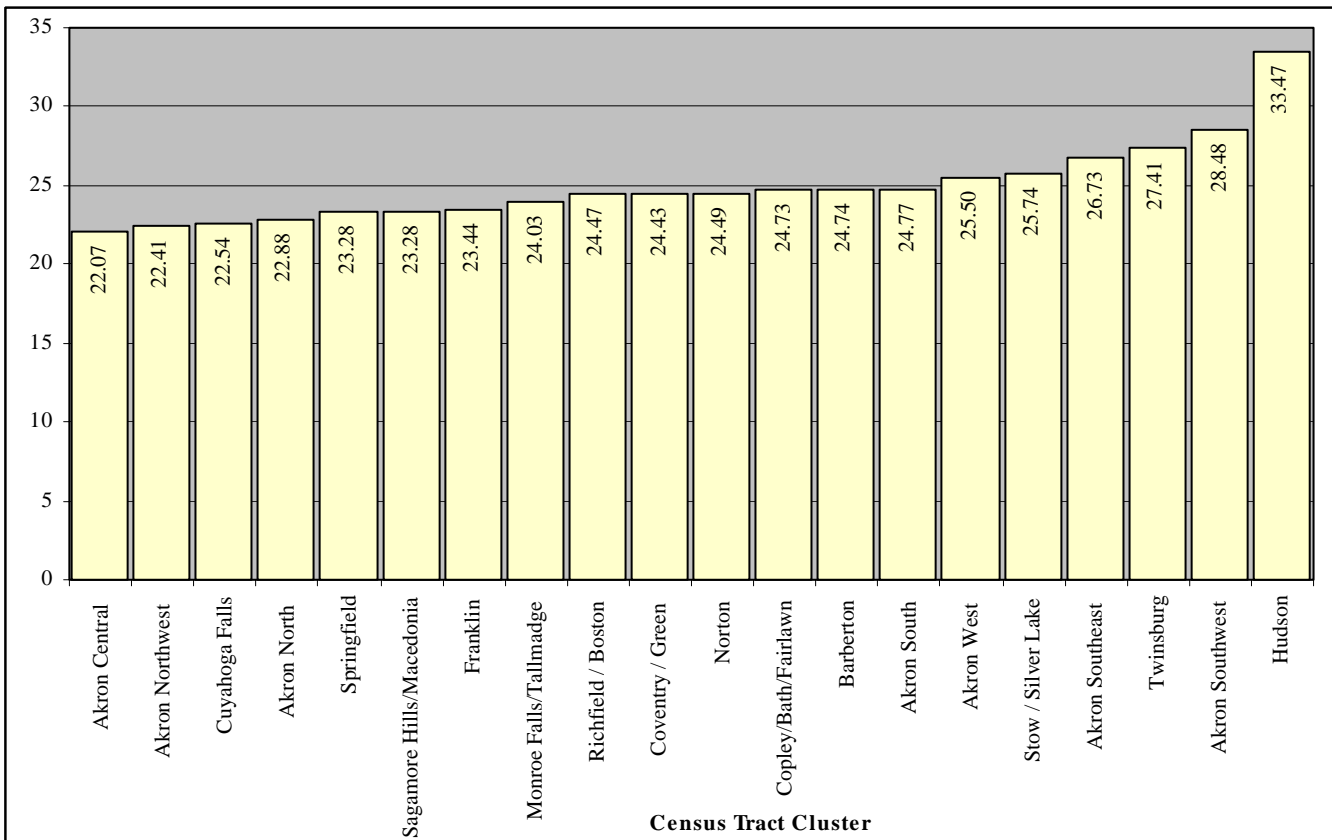




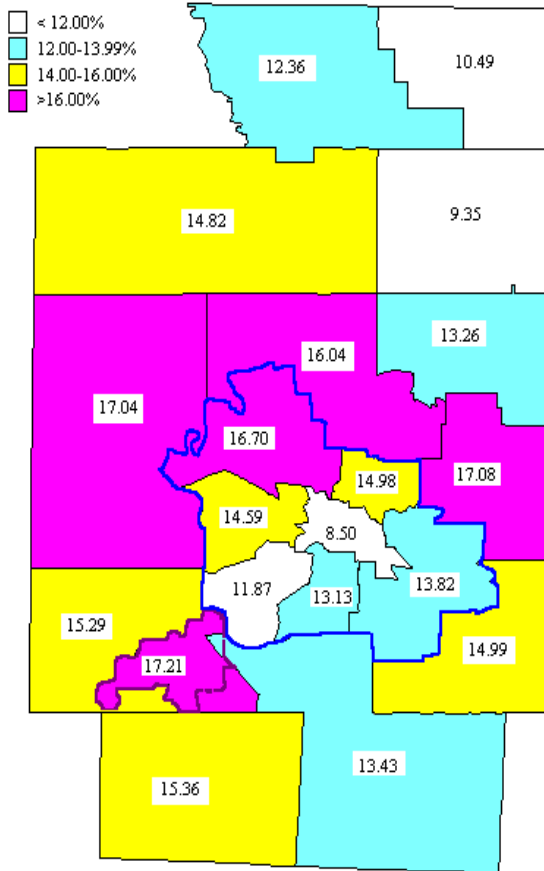
**% of Cluster Population Aged < 5 Years**



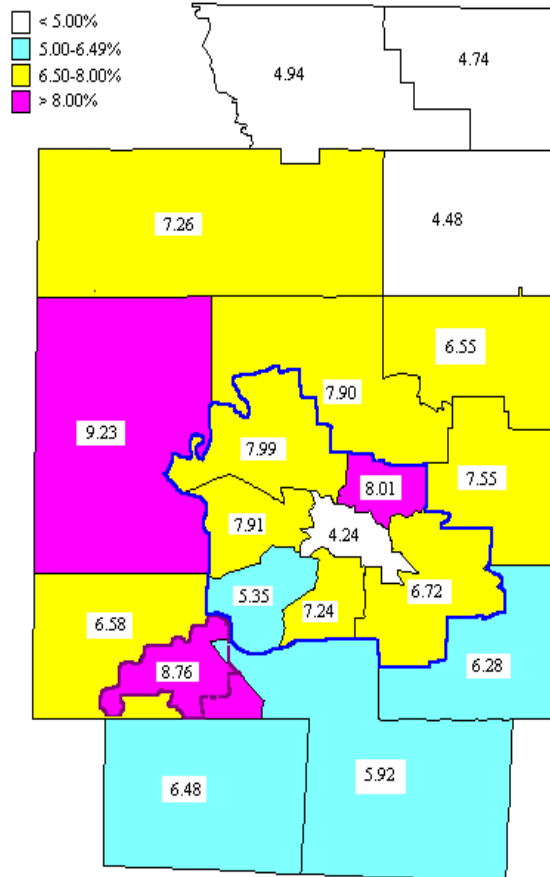
**% of Cluster Population Aged < 18 Years**



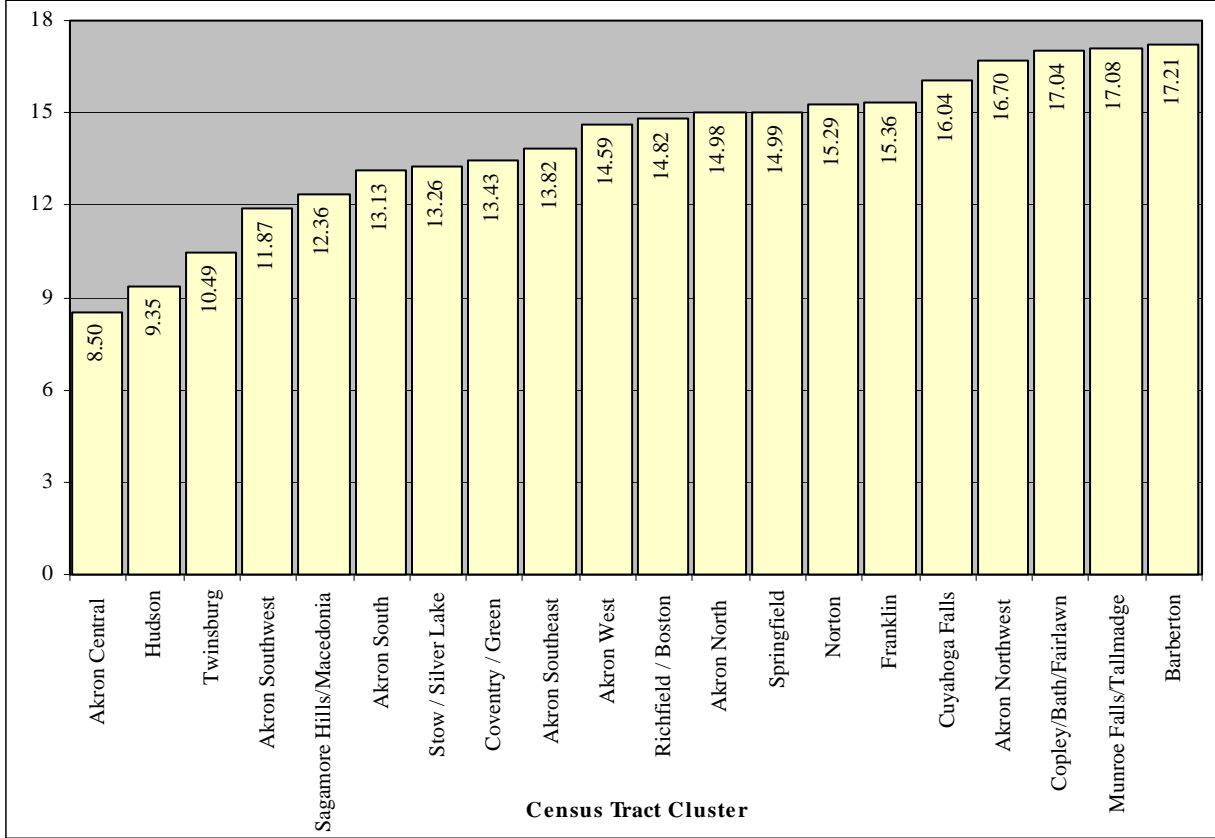
**% of Cluster Population  
Aged >65 Years (2000)**



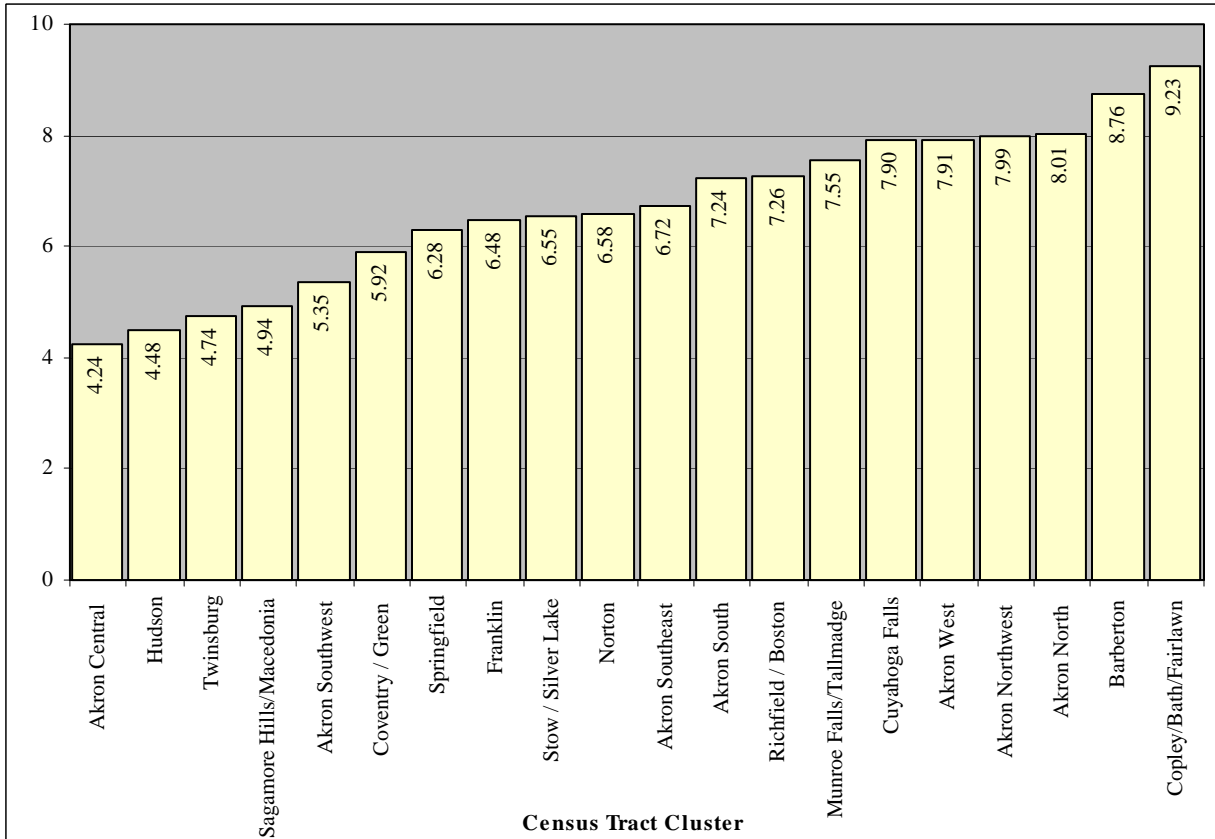
**% of Cluster Population  
Aged >75 Years (2000)**



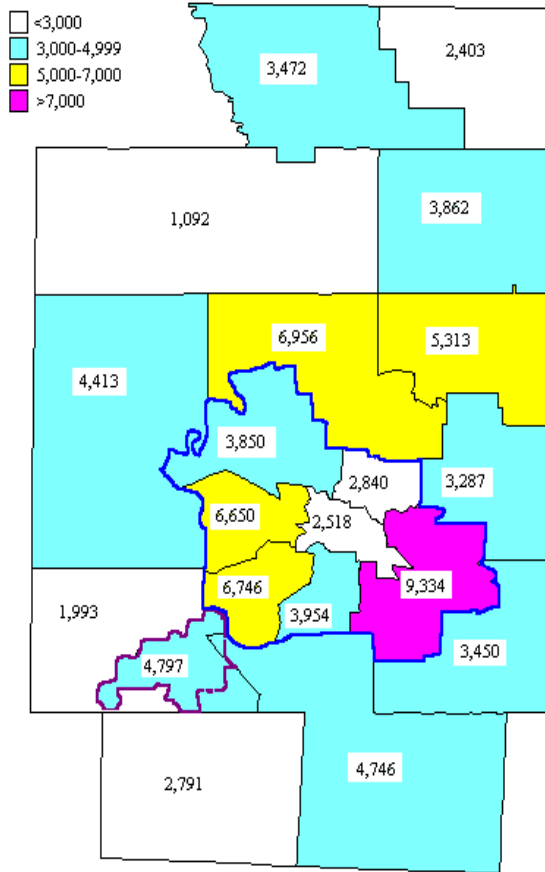
**2000 Population Aged 65+ Years**



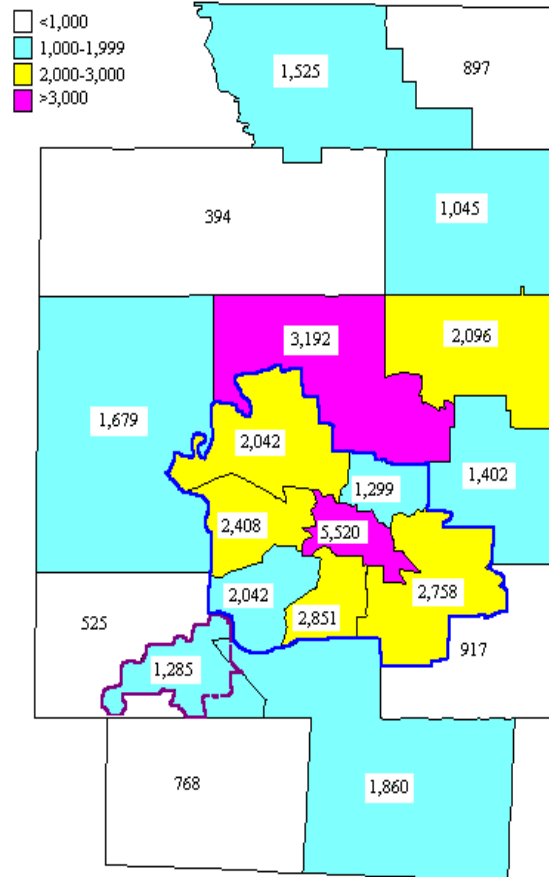

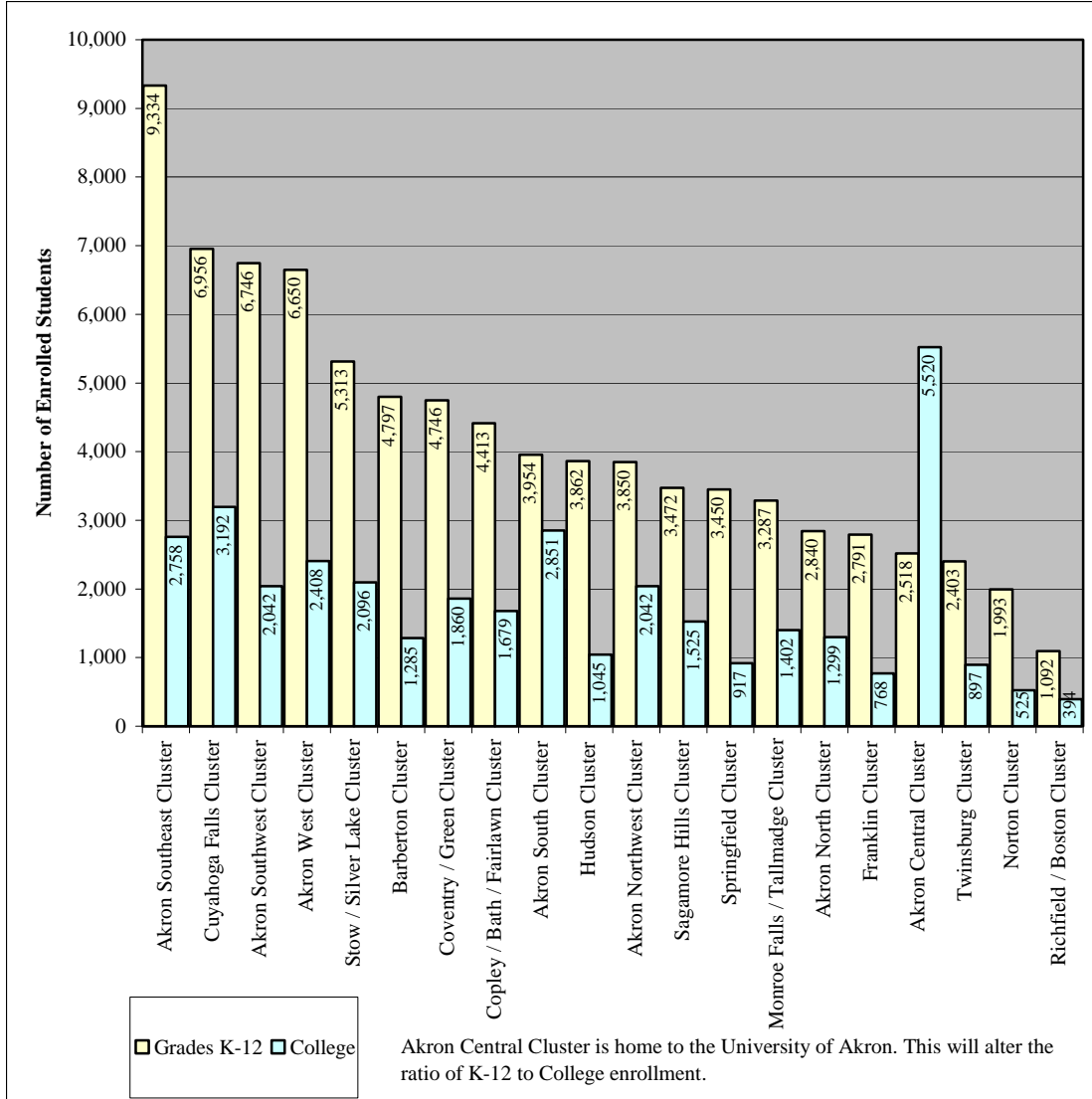
**1990 Academic Enrollment

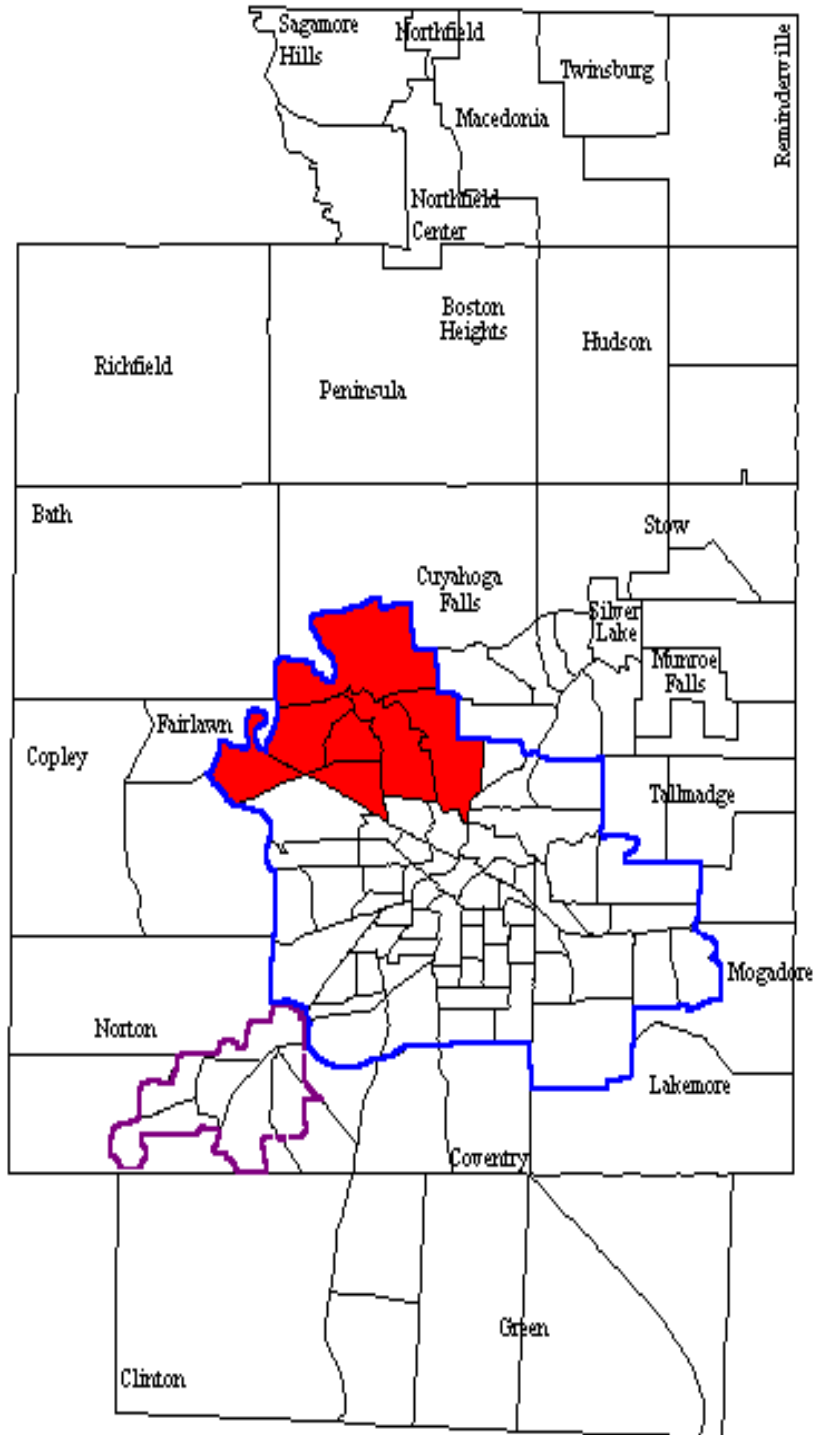


### 1990 Academic Enrollment Grades K-12 and College

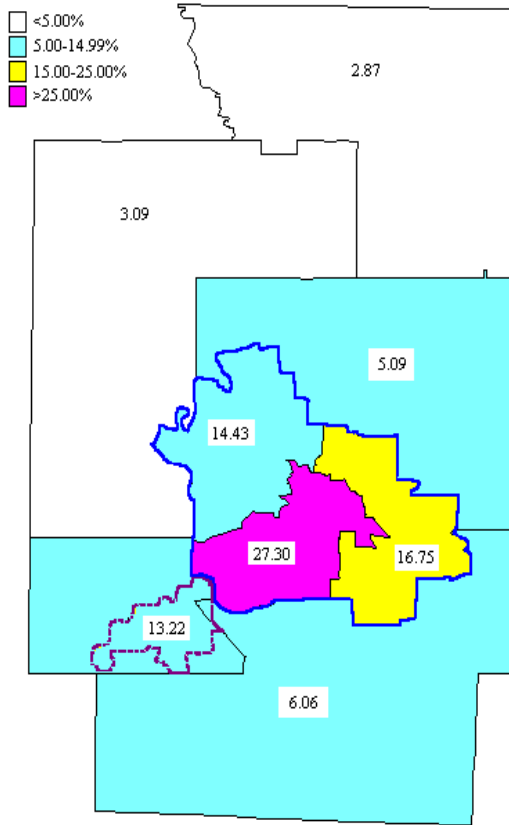




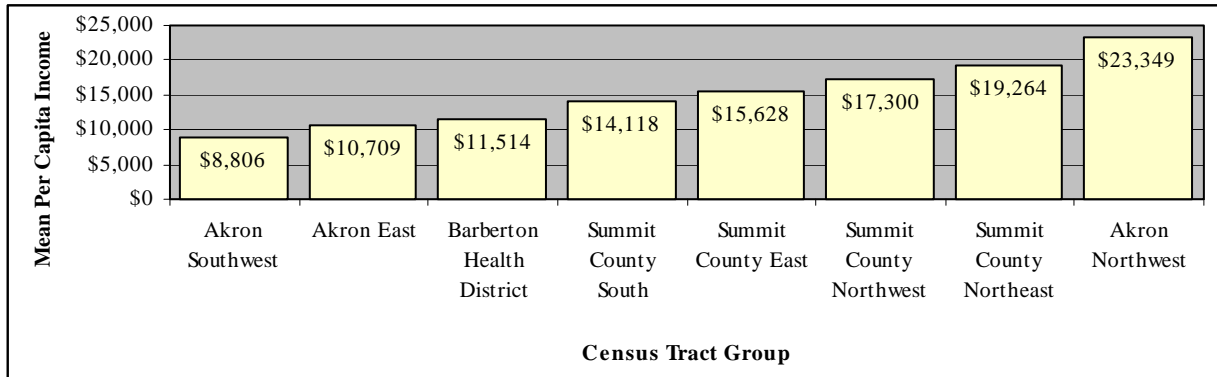
### Mean Per Capita Income



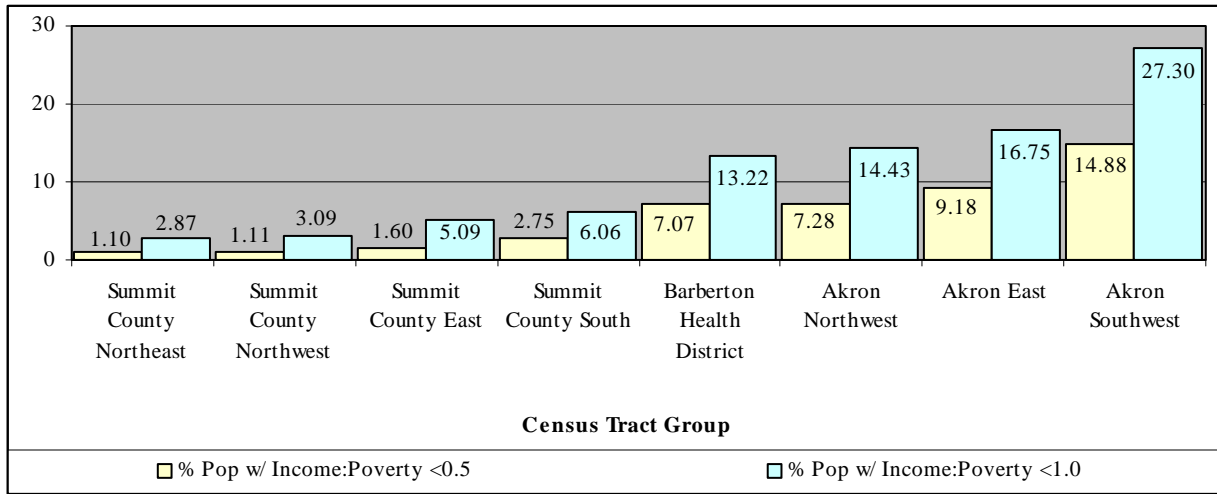

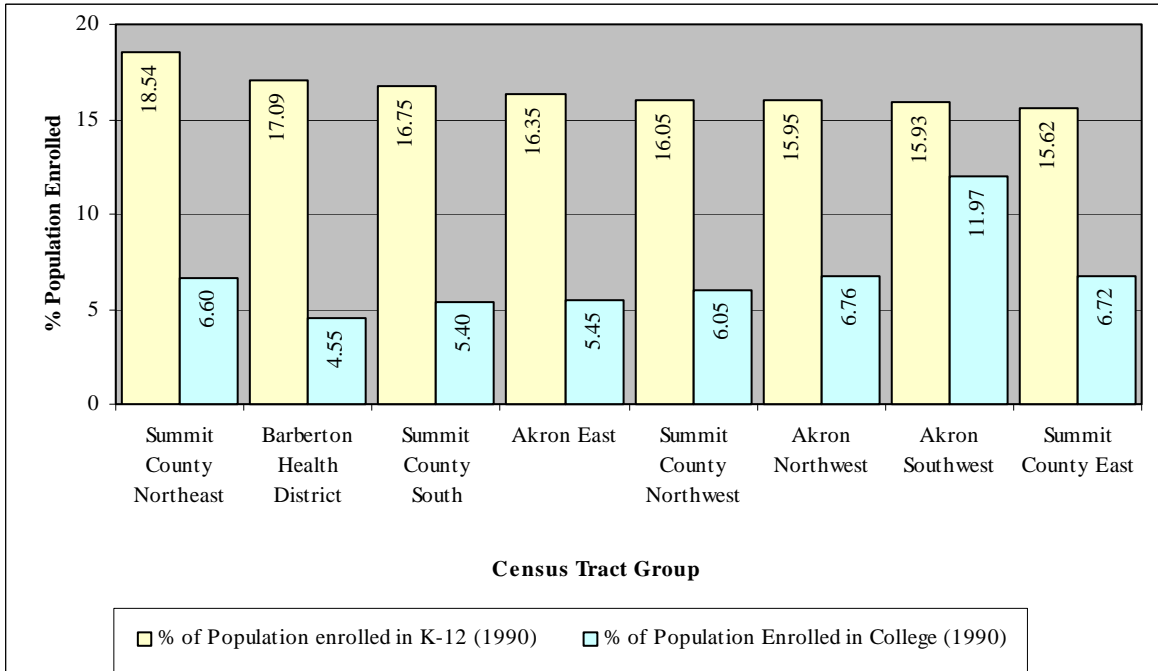
### 2000 Racial Distribution



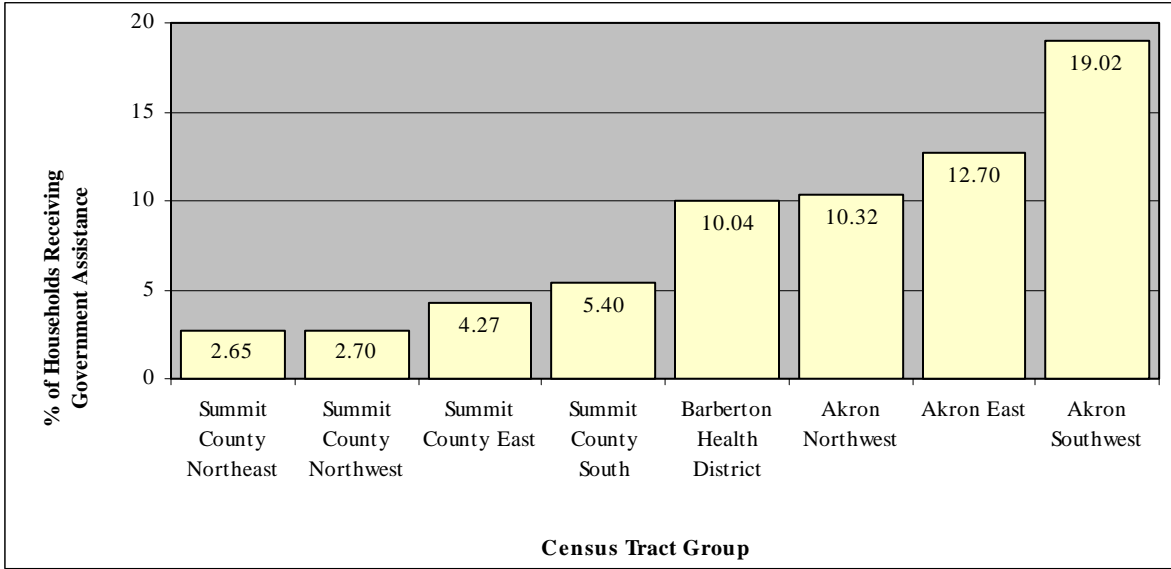

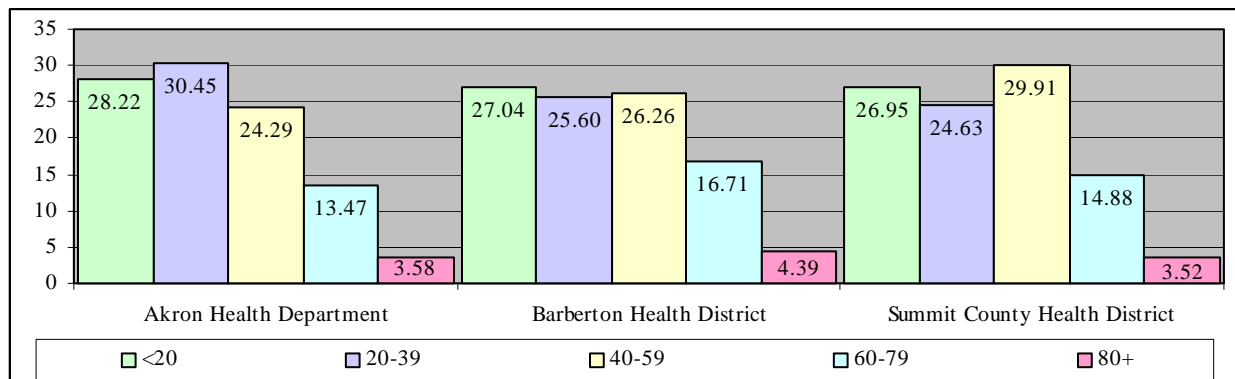
### 1990 Annual Per Capita Income



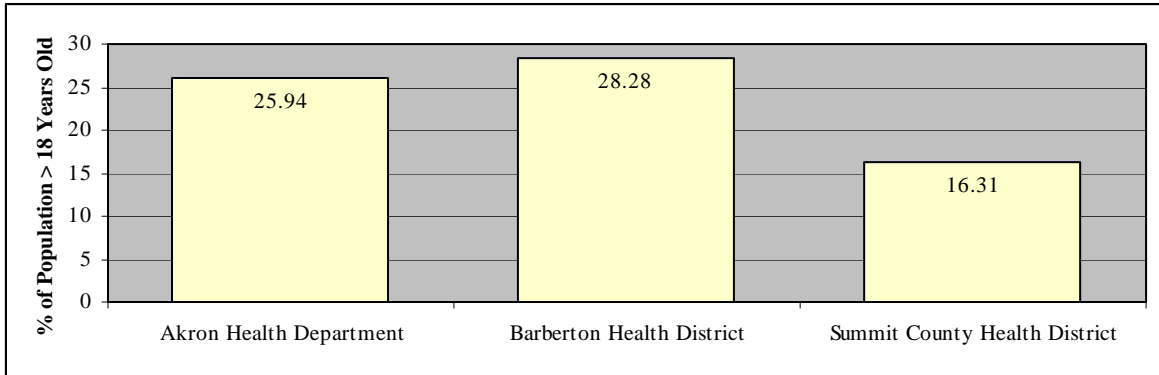
### 2000 Race Distribution



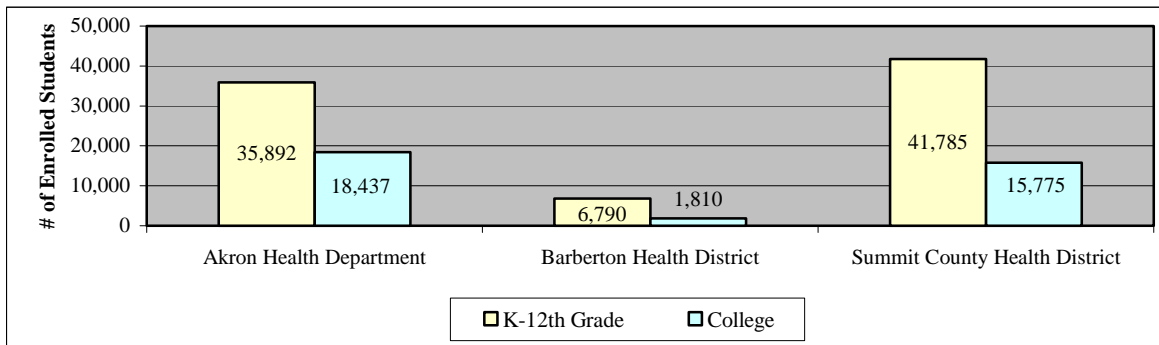
### 2000 Age Distribution



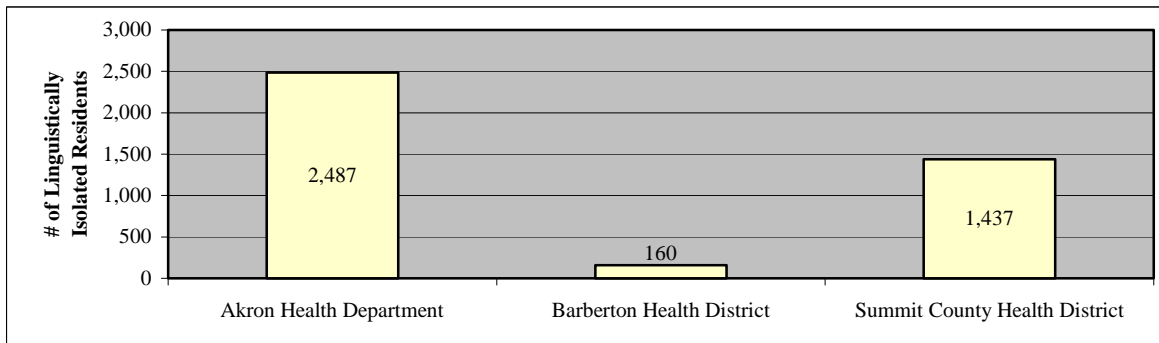
